

John McEwan Sugar Refiner, Merchant and Shipowner in Glasgow Esquire younger and only brother of Alexander McEwan of Sunderland, Island of Islay in the County of Argyll Esquire and second son of William McEwan of Flemington or Caldergrove Esquire by Ann daughter of John Macrae in the Parish of Cambuslang both in the County of Lanark, which William is son of Alexander McEwan by Jean Esden or Erden his wife, which Alexander was son of John McEwan sometime residing at Ruchmuzzle in the County of Renfrew by his wife Anna Campbell daughter of Campbell of Craignish in the County of Argyll who were married in the year 1724 as shewn by Extract of Proclamation of Banns from the Register of the Abbey Parish of Paisley under the hand of the Session Clerk of date the twenty second day of October last, and also a Certificate of Descent by James McEwan Esquire the Patentee's Uncle both produced. **Bears Azure on a Fess Argent between a Lion rampant in chief of the second and a Garb in base Or for McEwan a Ship in full sail on the sea betwixt a Thistle and a Stalk of Sugar Cane both slipped all proper for his professional pursuits all within a Bordure Gyrony of eight of the third and Sable for Campbell. Above the Shield is placed a Helmet befitting his Degree with a Mantling gules doubled argent and upon a Wreath of his Liveries is set for Crest the Trunk of an Oak tree with a branch sprouting forth on either side Vert and in an Escrol over the same this Motto "REVIRESCO".**

These Arms are destined by Letters Patent from the Lord Lyon bearing even date with this Matriculation the Twenty sixth day of April 1847 to the said John McEwan Esquire and his Heirs with due and proper Differences according to the Laws of Arms in all time coming the same being first Matriculated for them severally in this Public Register.
